Also remember that not all users may know the names and locations of various points on the IAP. Use distance and direction in your calls to communicate with those who may not have instrument training or are not familiar with the procedure.

Self check questions: Are option and overhead approaches (break) ATC assigned or ? **Airspace:**

Parachute operations in the vicinity of Hidden Valley Airport southwest of E68 and south of HWY 238. Now has a NOTAM.

Operations and Processes:

Stanfield Procedures continue to require all users to be alert and courteous in the area. http://www.aftw.org/cgz_practice_approaches.PDF was elevated on the web site and there are discussions to revise.

We remind ourselves to review circle to land options from an instrument approach: sometimes a circle to land could be back to an inbound runway, a circle could be in any direction unless restricted by the IAP, radius of circle varies with approach category (a larger radius could be used if the weather minimums for that larger radius are met.)
